A Note about the National Race Walk Rankings 2024

This 2024 list marks the 35th year since the rankings were first produced. They have appeared annually since 1991. The AC statisticians in the 1980s realized that they were not documenting race walking with the same care they brought to the other events. Since many race walks are held away from "mainstream" competitions, our results were often inadequately reported or just plain missed.

The leading statisticians of that era, like Jurgen Wittenburg, Tom MacWilliam, Bill McNulty and the great Cecil Smith, strove to "tell the story of the sport in numbers". They did so clearly and eloquently. They reflected, and at times led, the standards of the Association of Track and Field Statisticians (ATFS), which started in 1950 and which still provides the IAAF (now WA - World Athletics) with its own "story in numbers".

They therefore asked for help from race walk specialists. The collaboration resulted in Canadian statistics of uncommonly high quality, published in Athletics Magazine and AC's own "stats annual" for a number of years. **This is the reason for our present "reporting standards".** All other events were published in lists that recorded the 25 best athletes. The reporting standards for race walking enabled us to reflect an equivalent level. Those standards have remained relatively consistent since.

The advent of "computerized everything" should make compilation easier. Properly used, it does. But nothing substitutes for knowledgeable research and well-tested standards of quality, based above all in the sport's rules. Without that care, the very process can become inadequate. Generic programs – or those who operate them – can so easily prioritize convenience or flamboyance over the elegant simplicity of the sport's rules and practices.

Proper results relive the performances as the athletes first lived them. Recording their collective experiences is small contribution to our sport's history. Let us not just push buttons and assume our work is done; let us do the work <u>before</u> we push the buttons! In so doing, we continue the heritage, of the Smiths, the McNultys, the MacWilliams, the Wittenburgs and their like, that these rankings attempt to honour.

2024 At A Glance

Olympic Year, of course! But first, a couple of changes to our sport. Athletics-wide, the idea of "indoor" and "outdoor" tracks disappeared from WA's rule book in favour of "short track" and "standard track". A "short track" is now set at 200m (no word on other lengths), with a "standard track" continuing at 400m. The official reasoning seems a little obscure – it allows temporary 200m tracks to be set up in outdoor venues ("shopping malls and train stations" according to WA). Fine, but was that a pressing need? Nevertheless, hybrid indoor/outdoor facilities do exist, especially for field events, and are now recognized. We in Ottawa can also rest easier: the track in "The Dome" is now "standard" and no longer "oversized"!

Also, WA finally came to the realization that others have had for years. If the beloved 50km had to be shortened (a question that still seeks a logical answer), why not the 42.195km of the classic Marathon? And so it shall be, starting in 2026.

That also raises the question of the future of the Mixed Marathon Relay. With striking parallels to the original 1896 idea, outlandish at the time, to run from Marathon to Athens, (i) a few trials races were hurriedly put together and (ii) the athletes' commitment made the Paris event exciting and the proponents relieved. But it clearly was no physiological replacement for the 50km, as administrators tried to convince us. It was a flat-out paarlauf, where fourteen teams averaged less than 4:15 per kilometre to break 3h00. At least the Marathon gives us an "athlete-versus-the distance" event once more. That's great. We don't yet know whether the authorities will choose to keep the "relay" version. If they do, that's fine too.

The 2024 rankings show a slight improvement from recent doldrums. But if we look back 25 years to the 1999 rankings, for example, we see some 5th places as follows, with 5th in 2024 in parentheses:

Women 10km 52:36 (55:08) 20km 1h45:26 (only 4 ranked: 2h13:54)

Men 10km 47:08 (51:08) 20km 1h37:15 (1h48:23)

The good news is that the 2024 lists also show clearly that, when athletes get together to compete against each other, good things happen. Exhibit A, the WMA Championships in Sweden. So, for 2025, let's start going "back to the future". Let's first resolve to encourage competition outside our local confines. Let's make sure our clubs have a "representative budget" to encourage travel. We don't need a huge amount of money – we just need the idea to be established as a priority for those who would benefit. Our best athletes should be taking in at least part of "the circuit" in Europe, as they once regularly did. At least once a year, our up-and-comers in the East should be looking to the BC calendar for a challenge and our west-coasters should get on a plane for Toronto, Ottawa or Montreal. We're RACE Walkers, folks; let's RACE!

Mixed Marathon Relay

As in any relay, splits can only be approximate. Conventionally, they are taken when the baton passes the centre line of the permitted exchange zone, regardless of which athlete (incoming or outgoing) is holding it at that point. With no baton in the Mixed Marathon Relay, the assumption is that the same applies when either athlete passes the line. In this list, splits are recorded only when they appear in the official results.

It remains to be seen whether this event will be extensively contested. It is noteworthy that the World Championship in 2025 reverts to individual RW events at 20km and 35km. The event's creation for the 2024 Olympic Games resulted in some preparatory races around the world in 2023, one (in the USA) including Olivia Lundman and Dmitry Babenko. The two races below appear to be the first under the Athletics Canada banner.
